

STOP PRINCE WILLIAM COUNTY'S ANTI-IMMIGRANT RESOLUTION

On July 10, 2007, Prince William County approved an anti-immigrant resolution that will allow the police to interrogate persons regarding their migratory status even though they may have been detained for minor infractions. It also authorizes a memorandum of understanding between the county police and ICE officials, giving the police force immigration powers. In addition the resolution will make it possible to deny public services to the undocumented members of the community, and give county employees the power to demand proof of their status when they request or use public services. In addition, county employees can share a person's immigration status information with other local, state, and federal agencies including ICE.



This resolution has created great concern and fear, but we are organizing an appropriate and strong response to demand that it be rescinded:

- Civil rights lawyers are working on ways to challenge this measure in court.
- Citizen groups, churches, professionals, and broader community leaders are working together to fight this resolution.
- To communicate our call to county supervisors to rescind the resolution, community-wide campaigns are being conducted through letter writing, telephone calls, and emails.
- Immigrant community meetings were held in three locations in the county on July 23rd, 24th and 25th. Over 3,500 attended and decided by a majority (and almost unanimous) vote on the following actions :

ECONOMIC BOYCOTT

From Monday, August 27 to Monday, September 3

Do no spend money in Prince William County- Do not buy gas, clothes, food, school supplies, electronics, etc. **DO NOT BUY** at Potomac Mills, Manassas Mall, Wal-Mart, Giant, 7 Eleven, Safeway, Food Lion, Dollar Stores, McDonalds, Taco Bell, pizzerias, restaurants, movies, etc.

Immigrant owned businesses and those that publicly support our community and display a poster against the resolution will NOT be boycotted. If a business wants a poster, call the emergency line below. Prepare ahead of time by purchasing your supplies in Fairfax, Arlington, Stafford, Alexandria, and Washington, D.C.
